The works of mercy are charitable actions that help

Corporal works of mercy

These are charitable actions that help people with
their physical needs:

- Feeding the hungry
- Giving drink to the thirsty
- Clothing the naked
- Sheltering the homeless
- Visiting the sick and imprisoned
- Burying the dead
- Giving alms to the poor

Spiritual works of mercy

These are actions that help people with their
spiritual needs:

- Counseling the doubtful
- Following Christ with the witness of
your life
- Instructing the ignorant
- Admonishing the sinner
- Comforting the sorrowful
- Bearing wrongs patiently
- Praying for the living and the dead

In the Bible, Jesus focused on the works of mercy
as a criteria for the Last Judgment. The USCCB
says that these works of mercy are a model for how
to treat others, as if they were Christ in disguise.
This collection will be taken up **this weekend** at all
Masses.

CRY ROOM

If you feel the need to remove your child from the main body of the church but still wish to hear and see the Mass, our chapel, located up near the main altar on the left side of the church, doubles as our Cry Room. There is a black speaker located on the wall that can be turned on and the lights are located on the outside wall near the 2nd set of doors. Please note: children are not allowed to be unattended or just run wild in the chapel. This is a setting to teach your child how to behave in church without disturbing the atmosphere of the Mass. Also, you can bring your child to the back of the church—just make sure all the glass doors are closed.
